UNITED STATES COAST GUARD SECTION, PHILIPPINES

1. General Information

The United States Coast Guard Section, Philippines was established in 1946 under control of the Commander, Fourteenth Coast Guard District to direct and coordinate the Coast Guard functions within the geographical limits, of the Section. This included the operation of the Loran stations located at Batanes Island, Naulo Point on Luzon, Talampulan Island in northern Palawan, Tarumpitao on Palawan, and Catanduanes on Little Panay. To this end, the Section Commander exercised operational and military jurisdiction over the subordinate commands within the Section, administrative control, responsibility for logistic support, military readiness, liaison with other agencies, and such public information services as directed. The Coast Guard Air Station, with Gruman Albatross HU-16 aircraft, provided air logistic support to the Section units and functioned as a supply and receiving depot.

In April, 1971, the U.S. Coast Guard Loran Stations were turned over to the Government of the Philippines. The U.S. Coast Guard Air Station was disestablished and the HU-16's were turned over to the Government of the Philippines for use by Philippine Air Force. The Section Office at Sangley Point was closed, and the Commander, U.S. Coast Guard Section, Philippines was relocated in the Manila area at the Embassy Seafront Compound, Pasay City. The primary function of the Philippine Section is to provide until 31 December 1974 the technical consultants, administrative assistance and the necessary spare parts or replacement equipment for the operation of the five-Loran-A stations located in the Philippines and run by the Philippine Coast Guard.

The Commander, Coast Guard Section, Philippines also serves as Commander, Coast Guard Squadron Three, CTU 70.8.5, which is homeported at Subic Bay, Coast Guard Squadron Three was established in 1967 under Commander, Cruiser-Destroyer Group Seventh Fleet, CTG 70.8, and consists of high

Endurance Cutters assigned to Market Time Patrol off the coast of Viet Nam.

The U.S. Coast Guard Merchant Marine Detail, Manila, which is administratively attached to Commander, Coast Guard Section, Philippines, operates under the Office of Consular Affairs at the Embassy and maintains an office in the American Embassy, Manila.

2. Instructions to Personnel Arriving in Manila

a. Section Office Location. The Office of Commander, Coast Guard Section, Philippines is located in the Seafront Compound on Roxas Boulevard in Pasay City, Republic of the Philippines. Pasay City is a suburb of Manila, and Roxas Boulevard is the four-lane divided street fronting on Manila Bay. The Seafront Compound is approximately one quarter of a mile south of the Savoy Hotel.

b. Personnel arriving via Clark AFB contact Navy ATCO Clark for transportation to Manila. Renting of Clark special services vehicle (approximate cost \$8.50) is acceptable. Taxies and local buses are to be avoided, and personnel should be directed not to use local buses or taxies after dark for transportation from Clark to Manila.

c. Personnel arriving at Manila International Airport may call the Commander, Coast Guard Section, Philippines for transportation, if arrival is during office hours (telephone 59-80-11, extension 703, 704, 705, and 706). A taxi may be taken from Manila International Airport to the Section Office (cost approximately three pesos or 50 cents) if government transportation is not available.

d. There are no officer or enlisted quarters or messing available to the Philippine Section Office. Personnel reporting for duty or TAD should be financially prepared for hotel living. Reservations are normally not necessary.

e. Personnel passing through Manila enroute to Coast Guard Squadron Three should call the Philippine Section Of-

for travel arrangement to Subic.

f. Personnel arriving at Manila on leave status should check in at the Philippine Section Office upon arrival and keep the office advised of their address and how they may be contacted.

g. Office hours at the Philippine Section Office are 0700 to 1600 on weekdays; phone number is 59-80-11, extensions 703, 704, 705, or 706. After working hours, information may be obtained by calling LCDR ARNEY 80-86-21, CWO2 BRINDLE 80-63-97, EN1 HAYS 87-16-12, or EM1 RICASATA 80-80-04.

The U.S. Army Support Element, Philippines has the responsibility and capability for investigating vehicle accidents or other

incidents occurring in the Greater Manila Area involving U.S. Personnel and their dependents.

Should an accident or incident occur during duty hours, Monday through Friday, call 50-63-98, and an investigator will be assigned to assist you. He will coordinate with the local police to make a complete and immediate investigation, and will help whatever way possible. 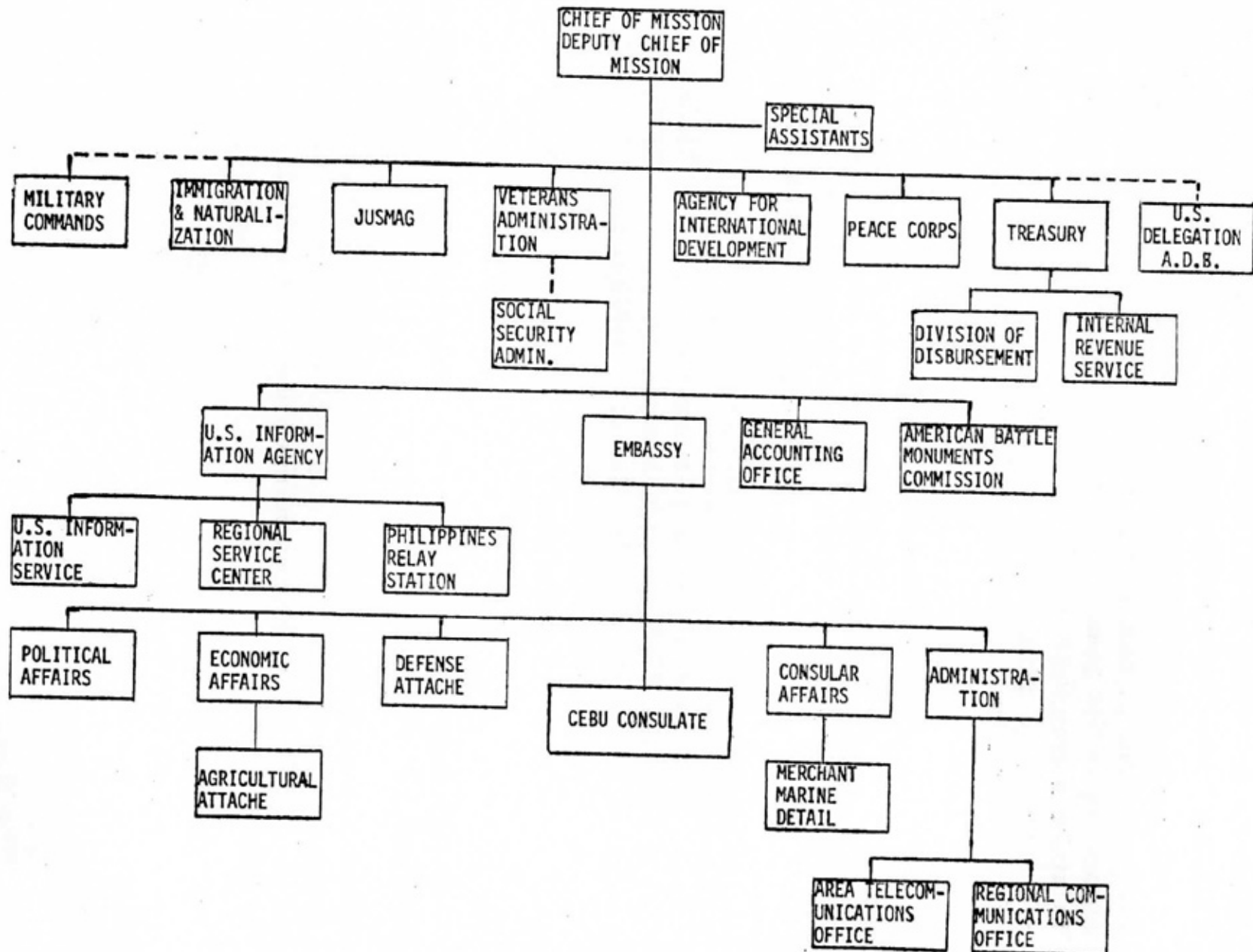
U.S. Currency is used only on U.S. bases and at authorized exchanges.
