The old station is vacant with a couple of conex trailers on it- heard the Embassy Suites bought it, not sure. Koloa is a neat town, not so much back then. CO was Bruce Blandford, according to the CG global, he's working as a civilian at Valdez AK. Danny was right about Chief Schlinke, great guy. I talked to him 15 years ago and he was in Nixon, TX. Has moved or ? since then. His son-in-law was (YN) Eric Borge-guess he retired from the CG a couple of years ago. The BM1 Smith mentioned was probably Stephen Taylor. As I was the YN, I still remember all those names: Perenick, Snedly, Barnes, Lopez, Medsker, Kelsall, Waterman, Fifield, Simpson, Tarrango, Bush. Cook was a Filipino-can't remember his name but what a great cook. I'm scheduled to get off active duty 1 Oct 05- just retired from the Postal Service.

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**On 05/02/05 Danny Smith** said:

I left a message on my other station boards so I didn't want to neglect Kauai. Lots of memories from my stay (73-74). I was a SNET fresh out of school. CO was LTJG Blanford. If my memory is correct the XO was Chief Schlinke who Steve Craig mentioned. He was a great guy and thinking back I had a lot of respect for him. We played softball on a local league, body surfed on Poipu beach and explored every inch of the island we could. I went out in the 40' boat once on a SAR (my one & only), because the radios weren't working and they needed an ET. Couldn't work on the radio because I started bouncing off the compartment ceiling once we left the harbor. The rest of the trip I was just an SN. Threw up my breakfast much to the delight of the BM1. The station dogs were Sherman & Penny. Besides working on the LORAN equipment & standing watches, I remember doing harbor checks for missing vessels once in awhile, working on the radio transmitter at one of the light houses once a month while checking out the tourists. I had 57' Chevy which used more oil than gas that we used to cruise the island in. Went back in 85' the station buildings were still there but I don't know who was occupying them. Poipu however, was washed out to sea and nothing but boulders. Bummer.

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**On 05/08/03 Steve Craig** said:

Just got back from Kauai. Sort of unsettling to just see an empty lot. Roads are still there and the bbq area that was built in 1974 is still there. It was built right after I left, I learned about it from now Sr. Chief Nelson Roll who is on active

duty(recalled) at MSO Puget Sound. He was a SN at the time. The place is still beautiful-we stayed next door at the Embassy Suites and went there at dusk to watch the sun go down. Hotels all over the place.
