Subj: Disposal of electronic equipment at LORSTA Sardinia, IT

Ref : (a) My 161302Z SEP 77 to G-EEE

1. The general closure schedule of reference (a) is being placed in effect.

2. We propose to dispose of electronic equipment at Sardinia as follows:

a. AN/SPN-30 Receivers and spare parts - shipped to LORSTA Rhodes, GR. These will eventually be surveyed there. They are in excellent operating condition. *OK*

b. AN/URT-17 transmitters and spares, survey locally. *OK*

c. FSK Keyer and Converters (CDCR-1200-170Hz, CDQT-316NB) with spares, return to SUPCEN. *OK*

d. COL-651S Receiver, retained by ACTEUR. *OK*

e. Test Equipment and spares, deployed with ACTEUR as required. *OK*

f. Common Oscillator System (complete), return to ~~EBCEN~~ ^{ELAB} ~~ELAB~~ *OK*

g. Loran-C Multicoupler (G-RWL-1711-2), return to EECEN. *OK*

h. Loran-C Antenna Couplers (FPN-46, 2ea), deployed within ACTEUR. ~~Return to SUPCEN~~ *Return to SUPCEN* *OK*

i. Simulator (G-W-541-S), to ACTEUR office. *OK*

j. Strip receivers (4) [R-1735A/URR], to SUPCEN. *OK*

k. Teletypes and patch panel, for 7990 TTY support via NAVSTA, Naples, IT. *OK*

3. A copy of Sardinia's CG-3134 is attached, for a more detailed listing. Some of the equipment we wish to retain is most important to our program (e.g., W-541-S simulator for checking DL-91 and Austron-2000C1 receivers), while other units have possible future use and would probably be lost in general Coast Guard inventory. If you do not approve of these general disposal plans, I request we have a telephone discussion of specific plans prior to your issuing final instructions.
