Dear Mr. Scott:

I understand that certain Forest Service lands in the Yakutat area are in the process of State selection, on a portion of which is located a road now serving as access to the Coast Guard Loran Transmitting Station, Ocean Cape.

In order to protect the Coast Guard's interest in this right-of-way, I herewith make application for the following notation of the records under the provisions of 44 LD 513:

That road referred to as the "Infantry Road," which runs in a southerly direction from the road referred to as the "Yakutat-Airport Highway," or the "28th Engineer Road," to the Coast Guard Loran Transmitting Station, Ocean Cape. A right-of-way 66 feet wide (33 feet each side of the centerline), and some 3 miles long. This right of way serving as access and egress to the Coast Guard Loran Transmitting Station, Ocean Cape.

I have enclosed a section of a Geological Survey map on which the path of subject road is marked in red.
