On 11/22/06 Pete Corson said:

It's been 54 years since ELMO 4 and 5. I've had the pleasure of reunion with Leroy Snider, Armand Petri, and John McCann. A few years ago I had the honor of representing the Coast Guard as a Korean War veteran in PA, and John McCann went to Korea on Air force two to represent the CG on the fiftieth anniversary of the war. With Leroy Snider and a bunch of others we started at Curtis Bay Maryland and took the units to the west coast where they were shipped to Japan and Korea. Elmo 4 was the first to be set up near Hyundai and we were attached to the 17th bomb wing of the fifth airforce until we got ther tents set up on the hill. Lt McCann's tent had a sign on it which read, 'The Curse of Elmo 4'. Just before Elmo 4 went on the air Jack Williams and I were sent back to Nomaike Japan where we built Elmo 5. I'd love to hear from anyone of that ilk.

On 07/27/01 Leroy Snider said:

I was assigned to Elmo 4 in the spring of 1952 and sent to Curtis Bay, Md. where it was being organized. Lt. John McCann was CC and some of the guys I remember are: Pete Corson, Bill Glenn, Alvin Bowers, Jack Williams and Bob Schellhaus. Pete Corson and I along with six other guys were picked to accompany the convoy of trucks that carried the equipment to Alameda, Calif. to be loaded on a ship for Japan and Korea. We were quartered at K-9 AFB when we first got to Korea and later moved into tents 'on the hill'. We ate red dust for a while and later on it turned to red mud. I remember it as a lot of hard work but a pleasure to work with a great bunch of guys. Would like to hear from anyone who was there during this era.

As I previously mentioned, I served there in '52/'53. I went through some of my stuff and found a 17th Bomb Wing (our USAF support) newspaper dated Dec 25 1952, there is an article in it all about the station. Also some photos of myself, my brother (a US Army Sgt.) and a bunch of the crew eating Thanksgiving dinner. Our chef (and I do mean Chef) was CS1 Vincent Lambert. There is also a photo of ET3 Lawson in the Signal Trailer and another of the Skipper Lt McCann, the XO Chief Pierce and Medic Chief Green. I also have a few photo's of the place.

I served at ELMO at PUSAN when then LT John McAnn was CO. It was put in full operation while I was there in 52 to early 53. A wild place indeed. and a crew that could appreciate good duty when it came their way.
