1. In accordance with reference (a) a survey of this Loran Station is submitted, herewith.

- (a) Recreational facilities are adequate and include
  - 1. Swimming and water sports in summer.
  - 2. Movies and outdoor sports year around.
  - 3. Organized off station recreation is permitted.
- (b) The cost of living- commissioned personnel \$60.00 per mo.  
 enlisted personnel \$15.00 per mo.
- (c) Dependents are not permitted at isolated duty stations.
- (d) The station is located in a temperate zone, with seasonal rainfall, humid weather in the summer, and mild winters.
- (e) The station is equipped with a dark room, comfortable living, and messing spaces.
- (f) There are no facilities for the upkeep of private vehicles, and the size of this island would not make this luxury needed.
- (g) Efforts are made to make a trip once a week to receive and post both official and personal mails.
- (h) The station has a Hospital Corpsman assigned, a well stocked Sick Bay, and is within a reasonable proximity of a Government hospital.
- (i) There are no advantages and by the same token; no disadvantages.

2. There is no further comment in the regards to duty at Loran Stations in the Far East Section, that involve this command.
