CITATION:

"For meritorious service from 14 July 1977 to 2 October 1977 while engaged in providing Loran navigational sovices the Central Northwest Pacific Ocean. Throughout this resion personnel of Loran Station Marcus Island maintained a useable small 99.96 percent of the time. This included the period whe Typhorn Ivy struck the island, leaving extensive damage to the set system and machinery spaces. Loran Station Marcus Island personnel displayed remarkable ability while keeping the station cerational and performing their mission continuously during this service storm. After the storm had abated, the Island's runway we found to be covered with sand, rocks, coral and other debris. The pera ing authorities of the runway estimated that it would take to to three weeks to re-open it. Demonstrating exceptional is to tive, Loran Station Marcus Island personnel worked around the clock clearing the runway which enabled a scheduled logistics flight to land two days after the storm. The outstanding skill dividence and devotion to duty displayed by personnel of Loran station Marcus Island reflect great credit upon themselves, their unit and the United States Coast Guard."
