COAST GUARD LORAN STATION MARCUS ISLAND, JAPAN

for services as set forth in the following:

CITATION:

"For meritorious service from 25 October 1.85 October 1986 in maintaining a remarkably high level of LORAN Station Marcus Island main ained a performance. 99.991 per cent usable signal for two nivety day periods, 6 September through 4 December 1985 and 11 December 1985 through 10 March 1986, earning FESEC Carst ing Performance Awards for both periods. This achie me, t was the result of a vigorous preventative mainte an e gogram and effective departmental training. During this period, the crew of LORSTA Marcus Island provide variant supervision over several major contracts including: (1) replacement of the 1350 foot LORAN transmitting twer, (2) major repairs to the fresh water storage system; and (3) repairs to the transmitter building roc. The unit accommodated an average of 30 Japanese contractor ersonnel each day over a 90 day period and at all time exemplified "American Good Will". They reconfigured c.ev li ing areas and served both American and Japanese meals of a two shift basis. Relations between contractor and Cast Card personnel were extremely cordial and helped to en ure that high quality contract work was completed or the Furthermore, the unit demonstrated outstanding laitilitive in using combat offload techniques to remove doutle and triple load pallets of tower materials from Pir Frce C-130 aircraft. The professionalism displayed during these offloading operations was recognized by the 345th Tactical Airlift Squadron. During this same per od LORSTA personnel also completed a major overhaul of NR 1 in diesel engine and repairs to station buildings . u 'ed by damage from Typhoons LOLA, VERA, and WAYNE. ea. work, professionalism and dedication to duty exhibited the crew of Marcus Island reflect great credit upon themselves, their unit and the U. S. Coast Guard.
