

## MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT

BETWEEN

## THE COAST GUARD LORAN STATION, POINT ARGUELLO

AND

## 1ST STRATEGIC AEROSPACE DIVISION

FOR

## COAST GUARD EVACUATION DURING LAUNCH

1. Upon determination by the Air Force that the Coast Guard LORAN Station, Point Arguello, California, will be in the Missile Flight Hazard Area of a scheduled launch, the following actions will be taken:

a. The Director of Safety, 1st Strategic Aerospace Division will notify the Commander, 11th Coast Guard District, Long Beach, California of the requirement to evacuate. This notification will be furnished as soon as possible, but no later than 24 hours prior to evacuation.

b. The Commander, 11th Coast Guard District will notify the Coast Guard Group Office, Santa Barbara and the Coast Guard LORAN Station, Point Arguello of the requirement to evacuate the station.

c. The Director of Safety, 1st Strategic Aerospace Division will coordinate the actual evacuation times with the Officer in Charge of the Coast Guard LORAN Station, Point Arguello and the 4392d Security Police Squadron, Missile Operations Support Section.

(1) Personnel will normally be evacuated 30 minutes prior to scheduled launch.

(2) Personnel will be returned to the LORAN Station when the area has been declared safe.

(3) Personnel will be allowed to return to the LORAN Station to insure that the equipment is operating properly when a hold occurs of sufficient duration to allow for safe entry and evacuation. COPY d. The Officer in Charge of the Coast Guard LORAN Station will insure that the station is set up for unmanned operation in sufficient time to comply with the evacuation schedule.

e. The 4392d Security Police Squadron, Missile Operations Section will provide transportation for Coast Guard personnel from the LORAN Station to the fall back area and return them to the LORAN Station when the area is declared safe.
